World Environment Day

On Thursday the fifth of June Josh, Logan, Holly and Sophia went to World Environment Day workshops.

We arrived at the Earthcare centre at Nine o'clock. We signed in and looked around and saw all of the workshops. At ten past nine we were welcomed by all of the volunteers. Eric was the owner of the Earthcare centre and Vicky was the host. Our first workshop was Edible Education. We had to figure out how many litres of water goes into the production of 1 kilogram of beef, pork, chicken, corn and soy beans. We had five choices of stickers, 13,000L, 4,000L, 3,500L, 1,500L and 800L. We found out that beef uses 13,000L to produce one kilo of beef, 4,000L for pork, 3,500L for chicken, 1,500L for soy beans and 800L for corn. We also Won Trevor the Ram .

The second activity, we personally thought was the best. We rode bikes that gave power to the light bulbs. The second bike was a blender. Steve filled up the blender cup with mixed berries , apple juice and honey. Holly rode the bike and blended the smoothie. It was YUM!

We also found out where to put solar panels by using a solar panel and a volt metre.

After recess we participated in the Love Food, Hate Waste quiz. If we won the quiz we would win a plastic lunch box. It turned out that everybody won so everybody won a lunch box.
