Newborns



Newborns love watching your face, listening to your voice and just being with you. Newborn play is simple. As your baby grows, she'll enjoy looking at a brightly coloured mobile, listening to a wind-up musical toy or learning to reach for a rattle.



Babies and toddlers



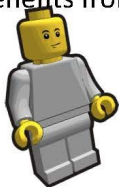
Your baby or toddler will probably enjoy playing with push-along toys, soft balls, cuddly teddies, blocks, board or cloth books, toy cars, simple puzzles and ride-on toys. Reading with babies and reading with toddlers is one of the most enjoyable things you can do.



School-age kids

Your school-age child will probably have a clear idea of what he wants to play with. At this age, you can often be guided by your child's requests or his particular interests.

Your school-age child still benefits from spending time playing with you too.



Preschoolers

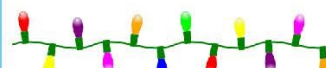
