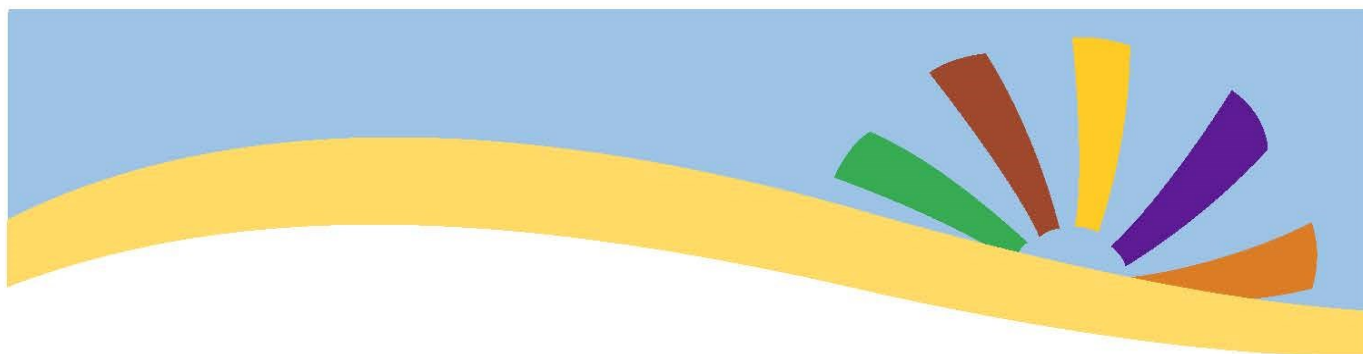

WHERE: Hobartville Public School, Valder Ave, Hobartville.

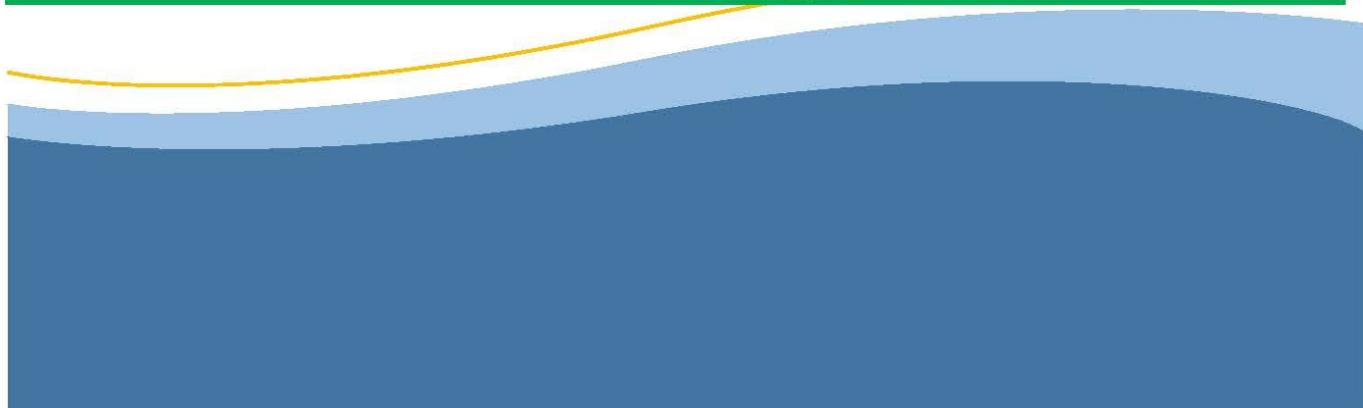
WHO: We welcome all children starting Kindergarten at any school in 2017.

SIGNS OF MILD TO MODERATE ALLERGIC REACTION

- Swelling of lips, face, eyes
- Hives or welts
- Tingling mouth
- Abdominal pain, vomiting (these are signs of anaphylaxis for insect allergy)

ACTION FOR MILD TO MODERATE ALLERGIC REACTION

- For insect allergy - flick out sting if visible
- For tick allergy - freeze dry tick and allow to drop off
- Stay with person and call for help
- Locate EpiPen® or EpiPen® Jr adrenaline autoinjector
- Give other medications (if prescribed)
- Phone family/emergency contact

Mild to moderate allergic reactions (such as hives or swelling) may not always occur before anaphylaxis

WATCH FOR ANY ONE OF THE FOLLOWING SIGNS OF ANAPHYLAXIS (SEVERE ALLERGIC REACTION)

- Difficult/noisy breathing
- Swelling of tongue
- Swelling/tightness in throat
- Wheeze or persistent cough
- Difficulty talking and/or hoarse voice
- Persistent dizziness or collapse
- Pale and floppy (young children)

ACTION FOR ANAPHYLAXIS

- 1 Lay person flat - do NOT allow them to stand or walk
 - If unconscious, place in recovery position
 - If breathing is difficult allow them to sit
- 2 Give EpiPen® or EpiPen® Jr adrenaline autoinjector
- 3 Phone ambulance - 000 (AU) or 111 (NZ)
- 4 Phone family/emergency contact
- 5 Further adrenaline doses may be given if no response after 5 minutes
- 6 Transfer person to hospital for at least 4 hours of observation

If in doubt give adrenaline autoinjector
Commence CPR at any time if person is unresponsive and not breathing normally

ALWAYS give adrenaline autoinjector FIRST, and then asthma reliever puffer if someone with known asthma and allergy to food, insects or medication has SUDDEN BREATHING DIFFICULTY (including wheeze, persistent cough or hoarse voice) even if there are no skin symptoms
Asthma reliever medication prescribed: ☐ Y ☐ N

How to give EpiPen®

- 1 Form fist around EpiPen® and PULL OFF BLUE SAFETY RELEASE
- 2 Hold leg still and PLACE ORANGE END against outer mid thigh (with or without clothing)
- 3 PUSH DOWN HARD until a click is heard or felt and hold in place for 3 seconds REMOVE EpiPen®

All EpiPen®s should be held in place for 3 seconds regardless of instructions on device label

Note: This ASCIA Action Plan for Allergic Reactions is for people with mild to moderate allergies, who need to avoid certain allergens

For people with severe allergies (and at risk of anaphylaxis) there are ASCIA Action Plans for Anaphylaxis which include adrenaline (epinephrine) autoinjector instructions

Child restraint fitting demonstration

According to the NSW Centre for Road Safety, two in three child restraint car seats are not being fitted properly. Make sure your child is safe with an inspection by a Roads & Maritime Services (RMS) Authorised Restraint Fitter.

The RMS has recently awarded Hawkesbury City Council a \$4000 grant towards the 2017/18 Child Car Seat Checks program. This allows Council to provide a subsidy of \$50 per child restraint which is checked for Hawkesbury families, with a limit of two checks per family. Most restraints can be completely serviced for this amount, however there may be a nominal charge for extras such as extension straps or hardware.

Residents who book an appointment on Tuesday, 1 August between 3:30 - 4:30pm at McGraths Hill will receive an extra children's road safety illustrated story book, a one-on-one child restraint fitting demonstration from the RMS authorised fitter, a complimentary gated buckle if required, and have all their child restraint questions answered.

Mayor of Hawkesbury, Councillor Mary Lyons-Buckett will be attending the fitting demonstration on Tuesday, 1 August as part of Local Government Week, which this year will be held from 31 July – 6 August.

"6.9% of crashes within the Hawkesbury LGA in 2015 resulted with injuries to motor vehicle passengers between 0-12 years of age. Fortunately all were wearing restraints and zero fatalities occurred, highlighting the importance of promoting restraints to help save children's lives.

The successful Child Car Seat Checks program has seen over 150 child restraint checks performed in the Hawkesbury over the past two years. Book your appointment now to have your child car seats, harnesses and booster seats checked for safety and proper fit," said the Mayor.

The appointed RMS authorised fitter is an automotive centre which has been operating out of McGraths Hill for the last 21 years. It has been voted annually since 2012 as a finalist for the Hawkesbury Local Business Awards, winning several of these and other industry awards.

Parents and carers can use the website <https://www.childcarseats.com.au/> to compare more than 200 different types of seats and find other Authorised Restraint Fitting Stations.

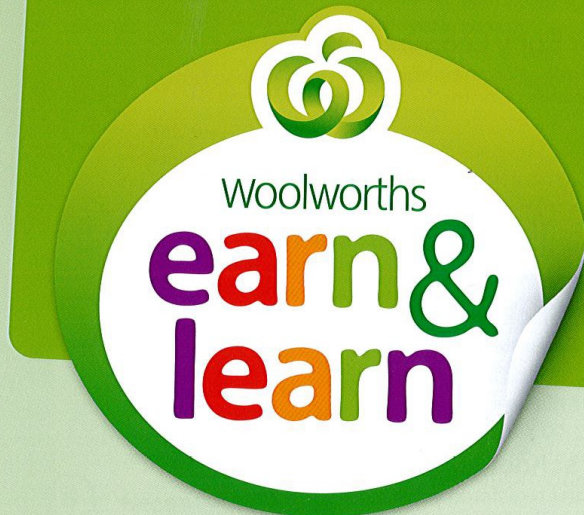
