Flying Horse Merit System



Hobartville has a 4 tiered merit award system where students receive cards and ribbons which accumulate to achieve the ultimate award, the Flying Horse Badge award. It is a repetitive process as there are four colours in the badges to achieve. Through keeping and trading awards the students can move through the levels.

The four tiers consist of:-

Well Done Cards

Blue Flying Horse Cards

Blue Ribbons

Flying Horse Badges

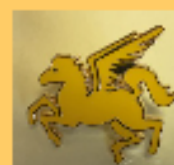
(yellow, blue, white and gold)

To progress through the tiers and different badge levels the following is an explanation of how students may progress and achieve the ultimate award.

- 5 Well Done cards can be traded for 1 blue Flying Horse card
- 5 blue Flying Horse cards can be traded for 1 blue ribbon
- 5 blue ribbons can be traded for the first level Flying Horse badge (yellow)

Once this first level is achieved the process begins again and all previous awards accumulate towards the achievement of the following level.

- **Yellow Flying Horse Badge** = the accumulation of 25 Well done cards and 5 blue ribbons
- **Blue Flying Horse badge** = the accumulation of 50 Well Done cards, 10 blue ribbons and a yellow badge
- **White Flying Horse badge** = the accumulation of 75 Well Done cards, 15 blue ribbons and a yellow and blue Flying Horse badge
- **Gold Flying Horse Badge** = the accumulation of 100 Well Done cards, 20 blue ribbons, a yellow, blue and white Flying Horse badge.

An important requirement of School Opal is the need for students to Tap On and Tap Off when they travel to and from school.

Opal data gathered by tapping on and off is used to determine demand for bus services.

If students don't Tap on and Tap off, services may be cancelled or reduced due to the lack of recorded patronage. With this in mind, we again ask for your assistance in reminding your students that tapping on and off at the beginning and end of each trip is one of the conditions of using a School Opal card.

This in turn helps us ensure we are able to provide the appropriate level of service to your students.

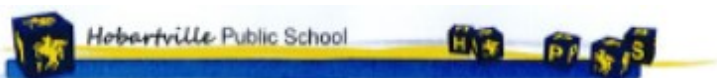
Please support Busways staff with afternoon boardings and checks to ensure minimal delays to bus departure times and demonstrate a united front to students on bus travel and Opal Card use.

Dear Parents / Carers,

ASSISTANCE URGENTLY REQUIRED

Many children and teachers suffer from allergies. These allergies are caused by a variety of things we eat, touch or breathe.

The symptoms of these allergies may be different for each person.

At Hobartville Public School, some of our students and teachers are allergic to peanuts and peanut based food, tree nuts and / or dairy foods, fish, oranges, strawberries and eggs. These people are:

- unable to eat / touch foods they are allergic to
- unable to come into skin contact with these foods
- unable to touch objects which have been touched by others eating peanuts, eggs, strawberries, oranges and dairy.

This is a **life threatening** (Anaphylactic) condition for these people. If they eat or come into contact with those foods listed above, they may experience an anaphylactic reaction which affects their breathing. There is no cure for Anaphylaxis. The only treatment is strict avoidance. 0.5% of a peanut is enough to trigger a reaction and traces can stay on surfaces for up to 2 months. As there are over 800 hands at school, the risk of contamination is extremely high.

In order to assist the staff and children's health and safety at our school, we request your assistance where possible.

How can you help?

- Please **do not supply sandwiches or snacks with peanut butter, nuts or nutella** and encourage your children to choose other foods.
- Remind your child **NOT** to share food with another child.
- Encourage children to wash their hands after eating. Teachers will be encouraging this during the school day.
- Discuss how allergies may be dangerous and can make people **very** sick.
- Encourage your child to call a teacher if they notice a person experiencing problems eg hives, is itching and scratching, or has trouble breathing.

How is the school helping these children?

- Training for teachers, information sessions for students and communication for parents throughout the school via the Newsletter.
- No peanut based products will be for sale in the Canteen.
- Students throughout the whole school will be encouraged to make Hobartville a 'Nut Free' Zone by not bringing foods to school which contain nuts.
- Developing an Individual Health Care Plan for each student at risk.
- Students' photographs will be placed in the Administration area, office, canteen, Library, classrooms.
- Whole School Action Plan for Emergencies.

We ask that you please assist us where possible with the food your children bring to school.

Our school caters for children with a range of special needs. Catering for students with severe allergies is one that requires us to work as a team to support these children at our school.

Thank you very much in anticipation for your support and understanding.

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Dear Parents and Carers,

For convenience and greater ease of collection and collation, we have included all of the necessary permission information required at the beginning of the year into one note. Please complete the following permission slips and return to your child's teacher as soon as possible.

INTERNET PUBLISHING PERMISSION

As the use of computers becomes more widespread so has the need to provide more access for parents and the community to daily happenings at Hobartville Public School.

Accessing the school website and Facebook page gives the Hobartville Community an alternate means of communication, a way of keeping parents informed of current programs operating at our school, as well as a means of visually sharing some of our special events.

In a broader sense it serves as a means of promoting our school for any prospective families intending to move into the area.

There are certain departmental guidelines we must adhere to for the publishing on the internet.

These guidelines are listed below:

- * Full names of students are not published
- * Student first names are not directly linked to a photograph
- * Parental permission is required for any student's photograph, which is published
- * Parental permission is required for any student's work that is published

At times there will be group photos of students, individual photos and possibly some student's work on the website. At no time in the publication of these items will a student's name be directly linked to a personal photograph. There may also be parents in some of the photos taken at special occasions.

PERMISSION FOR THE RELEASE OF HOBARTVILLE PUBLIC SCHOOL STUDENT INFORMATION

Throughout the year opportunities arise that promote Hobartville Public School, our students and Public Education. Given the likelihood of such opportunities arising, it is necessary for the parent / carer of students of Hobartville Public School to authorise any use of student names, photographs of students and/or their work, use of video and information relating to the reason for the student being involved in the promotion.

In all cases, no further information will be made available in accordance with your rights to privacy.

At all times, you will have the right to withdraw (in writing) such permission.

AGREED CODE OF BEHAVIOUR FOR USE OF TECHNOLOGY AND THE INTERNET

Computer facilities at Hobartville Public School are for educational purposes. The goal in providing these facilities is to promote educational excellence in teaching and learning programs via increased use of technology. The school is firmly committed to the proper and responsible use of all forms of technology by its staff and students, and, to this end, requires acceptance of, and strict adherence to the terms and conditions of this user statement.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

Access to technological equipment at Hobartville Public School is a privilege to which certain responsibilities apply. This privilege is extended to all students annually, providing they work within the bounds of the rules defined by the school.

Students wishing to use technology equipment and the internet must abide by the following rules:

- I will treat equipment with care at all times.
- I will use appropriate language at all times when using computers, iPads, digital cameras and digital video cameras.
- I will use the resources available through the internet to sensibly research school assignments.
- I will respect laws pertaining to copyright.
- I will avoid websites that may have offensive or undesirable material.
- I will inform an adult if I find something that is inappropriate.
- I will inform an adult if I am aware that my peers are looking at, or for inappropriate sites.
- I will not use the internet for private or personal communication.
- I will not download any files from the internet without permission from a teacher.

- I will not install and run software, including games from home or that I have found on the fileserver.
- I will not delete, change or alter in any way, the appearance, sound or set up on any computers or other devices.
- I will not play games of any description on a computer without first seeking teacher permission
- I will not interfere with any other student who is using a computer or other equipment.

If a student violates **any** term or condition of this Code of Behaviour or the computer room rules, a note will be sent home informing parents. This will result in a child being unable to use any form of technology for up to two weeks.

A student who does not return the signed consent forms will not be allowed access to equipment or use of the internet at school.

Premier's Reading Challenge 2018

Students at Hobartville Public School are encouraged to participate in the Premier's Reading Challenge (PRC). Reading not only develops lifelong reading skills, but it also facilitates the development of skills in comprehending texts, sentence structure, spelling strategies, extending vocabulary, correcting punctuation, and broadening imagination. Reading should be embraced by everyone and supported in student learning. Details of the challenge are outlined below and are also available on the PRC website at <http://www.schools.nsw.edu.au/premiersreadingchallenge/index.htm>.

For each student completing the Premier's Reading Challenge the permission slip will need to be completed and returned to the class teacher. This is required for the students to be publicly recognised with their name appearing in an Honour Roll in the Sydney Morning Herald. This year ALL students from Kindergarten to Year 2 will be participating in the PRC. Rather than the students completing the challenge at home, their Class Teacher will complete the challenge with ALL of their students, and then enter the Reading Data online for all of their students.

Parents are encouraged to continue reading a variety of books with their child/ren at home with age appropriate and enjoyable texts to target interests, comprehension and a love of reading.

Students from Year 3 to Year 6 will continue entering their individual Reading Data online using their DoE Username and Password.

School Environment / Gardening Program

Many Hobartville students will be actively involved in the school environmental program during 2018. This will involve students working in the garden and will include a variety of activities including tree planting, weeding, mulching, watering and composting. These activities will be supervised by teachers and parents.

Students will also gain an understanding of sustainability, composting and worm farming.

Students will be supplied with gardening gloves, however students are permitted to bring the own.

Tamplin Field

Throughout the school year, students access Tamplin Field, adjacent to the back playground for sporting carnivals, Class/stage fitness, weekly sport lessons and team training.

Students walk through the side gate and enter the field just beyond the school boundary or walk through the back boundary gate directly on Tamplin Field. This is dependent on the water way.

Students are always accompanied by a teacher.

Crunch and Sip

Crunch and Sip is a program being implemented in 2018. It is a fruit break in the middle of the morning learning session. Students are encouraged to bring fresh fruits and vegetable to school as a snack and water. Further information about what is and isn't allowed will be coming home shortly. It is a Department of Health initiative. Avoidance of oranges would be greatly appreciated.

PG Rated Material

At times throughout the year, students as part of their learning program watch DVD's and movies. This could also be at School Camp. Some material that can be related to their program could be rated PG. Teachers monitor very closely the appropriateness of viewing material and make sure that it would not offend and be appropriate to the audience. This permission covers these times rather than sending home individual notes.
